Join us for our SocSimFesT session to learn about the kind of questions that international law scholars ask themselves – and discuss the potential of agent-based modeling in helping us answer them! To kick us off, Tomer Broude (Hebrew University) will talk about the ongoing debate on determinants of deterioration from war to war crimes in international armed conflict, and Kai-Chih Chang (Soochow University) will introduce the problem of bloc voting at the International Court of Justice. Afterwards, we want everyone's input - how can these questions be approached from an agent-based modeling perspective? Where to start and what to keep in mind? What models might already be out there and can be helpful?

With this workshop, we want to initiate a dialogue between international law scholars who are interested in agent-based modeling, and the modeling community. With concrete research questions we plan on having a lively exchange of ideas, while keeping in mind the overarching question of how agent-based modeling can be applied in international legal research more generally.
